Rick is the designer and creator of the Laguna Niguel City Seal, Laguna Niguel's logo. This City 'logo' Seal identification is plastered over City events, vehicles, and documents.


Rick will share with us what went into his thought development of this distinct Laguna Niguel City Seal which serves as something of a coded visual history and elements of Laguna Niguel touching on the basic view of the history and modern changes within the elements of Laguna Niguel paying homage to the area's ranchos in



the 19th century. The seal incorporates the lariat. Or a lasso, for roping cattle unlike the rope used in surrounding City logos. The Seal ensures both historical elements and has a contemporary feel to

stand the test of time. All of this original artwork completed by hand before computer availability.

The 3rd grade classes in Laguna Niguel schools are using the City Seal as a base for teaching our city's history. The

The Laguna Niguel Oral History Project


The Oral History Project committee, consisting of **Solveig Darner**, **Sheryl Bailen** and myself, have officially begun filming interviews with long-time residents of Laguna Niguel and community leaders in an effort to preserve the history of Laguna Niguel. After experimenting with a preliminary interview with long-time resident **Dennis Devine**, who returned to Laguna Niguel for a visit in 2013 after moving to Oregon, we began regularly scheduled interviews on May 23, 2016. Our first interviewees were **Kathleen Lechner**, an artist, long-time resident and active member of the Laguna Niguel Woman's Club, and **Carol Merker**, another long-time resident who still lives in the one of the first developments built in Laguna Niguel that is still within the current boundaries of the city. The following day we interviewed long-time resident **Sheila Benecke**, a former member of the School Board and a past president of the PTA and the Laguna Niguel Woman's Club. On Thursday, May 26, our guest was **Tim Casey**, Laguna Niguel's first City Manager, who served the city in that capacity for more than twenty-three years. Finally, on Friday, May 27, we heard from **Carole Allen**, a long-time resident and former elementary school teacher, who taught at Crown Valley Elementary School for thirty-seven years. During that time, she also founded the California Junior Light Opera Company, which she directed while she taught at Crown Valley Elementary.

Videos of our oral history interviews will become part of the historical record, being stored on our MacPro computer recently donated by architectural historian and Historical Society member, Ted Wells. We will also be uploading copies of the interviews to YouTube, to permit our interviewees to share their videos privately with friends and relatives.

Our Oral History Project will continue indefinitely until everyone who has played a role in the history of Laguna Niguel and wishes to be interviewed has had the opportunity to do so.
