April 9 - General Meeting Guest Speaker - Ted Wells

ery pleased to announce Ted Wells, distinguished architect, and member of Laguna Niguel Historical Society, has graciously accepted our invitation to speak at our 5:00 general membership quarterly meeting at the Laguna Niguel Library. The topic, 'ENRICHING & CHANGING SUBURBAN LIFE: THE NEXT 55 YEARS OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EARLIEST MASTER PLANNED COMMUNITY.'

Ted is the principal at Ted Wells Living Simple, LLC. His designs include houses, community buildings, monasteries, gardens and neighborhood & community planning projects throughout the U.S., as well as restorations of significant historical properties by noted architects. His historical planning consultations include reuse plans of the Presidio in San Francisco, the Long Beach Naval Shipyard, and Exposition Park in downtown Los Angeles. He is currently coordinating the creation of the largest historic district in Sacramento. Ted's own house in Laguna Niguel was recently selected for inclusion in a new book 'The World's 100 Best Houses.'

Ted will be sharing the history of Laguna Niguel's 'secret treasure'. The Horizon House, one of the first residences to be built in Laguna Niguel and would be the first historically designated house in Laguna Niguel.

Resting on a small landscaped bluff, the home's 360-degree round design plan, and use of highly durable materials was thought to be the dawn of a new era in low-cost and maintenance free architecture still drawing attention. It was designed 52 years ago by local architects and engineers dubbed by many "The House of Tomorrow". The home was officially labeled the Horizon Home and has hit is 50 year mark so is eligible for inclusion on the National Register of Historic Places through the Department of Interior.
