ick and his wife Mary are natives of Orange County born in Anaheim. They have lived in Newport Beach for the past 42 years. Dick's ancestors arrived in Orange County in 1875. Dick's professional planning career began with the Orange County Planning Department in 1959. When he left the County in 1973 he was serving as the Administrator of the County's long range planning program. He founded The Planning Center in 1975. The Planning Center is a nationally recognized land planning firm specializing in new town planning and the preparation of general plans for cities and counties. Dick retired in 2005. A graduate of U.C.L.A., he is a student of Orange County history and is currently writing his family history.

Dick will discuss the historical context in which the community of Laguna Niguel was created. He will give us his perspective of what the environment was like for the creation of a new community, what tools were available to guide the development of a new community and what the politics were like at the time. This program promises to be both informative and entertaining.
